



## **I. Information according to Art. 13 DS-GVO on the occasion of entering the buildings, making use of offers and participating in activities at the University of Stuttgart**

### **3. Categories of data**

Contact information from persons in attendance, particularly visitors, users or participants: first name and surname, address, date and time of attendance, place (lecture hall) and, if available, the telephone number.

When collecting data **in paper form**, a student's ID number is collected instead of their first name/surname and address, and the name of an employee's institute/facility is collected instead of their signature.

When registering and deregistering for the purpose of documenting attendance as part of data collection **via ECUS**, a person's ECUS ID is collected instead of their first name, surname and address.

When registering and deregistering for the purpose of documenting attendance as part of data collection **via QR code/ST account**, a person's so-called SIAM ID is collected instead of their first name, surname and address. The SIAM ID is a number in the system which is unambiguously assigned to a certain person.

With the help of this data, the data available in other administration systems belonging to the university (particularly C@MPUS), which is required by the regulation of the state government on infection prevention measures against the spread of the SARS-CoV-2 virus (Corona Regulation), can be determined should this information be requested by the health authorities or the local police authorities.

### **4. The reason for processing the data and the consequences of not providing personal data**

The data is processed for the purpose of tracking possible transmission pathways in connection with Covid-19. Any other use of this data is not permitted. Without providing this data, it is not permitted to enter the university, use its offers or take part in events held by the university.

If the person does not check out, he or she will be considered to be present for six hours after checking in. This means for example that if a request from the health authorities only relates to the period between 1 pm and 4 pm or to the afternoon, a person who checked into the university at 8 am and stayed until midday but didn't check out will be reported to the health authorities as also having been present



between 1 pm and 4 pm, since the person is considered to have been on site until 2 pm.

## 5. Legal basis

Article 6 (1) letter c) in conjunction with Section 32 in conjunction with Sections 28 to 31 of the Protection against Infection Act (IfSG) in conjunction with Section 14 Sentence 1 No 1 and Section 6 of the Corona Regulation, as well as Section 4 (1) of the Corona Regulation for study programs and art. The legal basis for the collection of student ID numbers, information on a person's institution/facility, ECUS ID, SIAM ID is Article 6 (1) Page 1 letter e) together with Article 3 GDPR and Section 4 of the Data Protection Act of Baden-Württemberg.

## 6. Recipients

The data must be reported to the health authorities or the local police authorities on request.

## 7. Duration of data storage

Information on attendance times will be deleted four weeks after collection. The "corona contact information" stored in C@MPUS (address and, if available, telephone number) will be deleted when no legal regulations exist which oblige the university to process this data.

## 8. Your rights

- You have the right to receive information from the university concerning the data saved in relation to your person, and/or to have incorrectly saved data corrected.
- In addition, you have the right to deletion or to have the processing restricted or to object to the processing.

- You have the right to complain to a supervisory authority, should you be of the opinion that the processing of the personal data relating to you breaches legal regulations.

## II. Information about your right to object to having your data processed in accordance with Article 21 (1) GDPR
